IN MY OWN WORDS

The island of Haiti has been part of my life since delivering 125 donated wheelchairs to St. Vincent's Children's Hospital and Orphanage in Santo 17, Port-au-Prince, in 1998. On that trip with a West Hartford mission group, I was introduced to the resilience and courage of the

Haitian people. In 2010, Dr. Michael Bourque, a longtime friend (and fellow Eagle Scout back in the 60's) invited my wife, Kathy, a pharmacist, to join a mission trip to the Dominican Republic, and I accompanied her to the informational meeting at St. Francis Hospital. There Dr. Mike and I discussed our mutual interests in mission efforts and Haiti, and he invited me to join the trip as a "general helper".

In 2011, Dr. Mike's group began the search for a permanent destination for mission trips and selected Hôpital de la Communauté Dame-Marienne (HCDM) in Dame-Marie. The people of this fishing village on the southwestern tip of Haiti had minimal medical care and no surgical services. With a background in Health Care Management and mission experience, I was then asked to be part of the reconnaissance team to Dame-Marie where the goal was to restore the hospital in preparation for restarting surgical services. There was also a need to set up housing for the visiting mission teams.

The first surgical team members stayed in the vacant family home of Pierre Antoine, Dame-Marie administrator. Since then the house has been improved to better shelter mission teams with conveniences such as a generator, new mattresses, fresh paint, window screens, running water and showers. The hospital, too, has had dramatic improvements with upgraded surgical suites, pre- and post-op rooms, labor & delivery areas, and clinic areas that can see over 100 patients daily.

Most mission members are medical professionals, but as a "general helper" I had various tasks from repairs to construction. issues. In time, I was able to triage clinic patients. My role on these trips is concluding, but the mission teams can almost always use a "general helper". It is a unique, non-medical means of supporting mission teams and caring for the Haitian people. Mission Trips

Resumption of trips is unknown at this time.

- *ICU with Neonatal Services* to be completed in successive stages over the next 1-2 years.
- Staff Training ongoing; recent topics included CPR, newborn resuscitation and pre-operative preparation.
- Community Awareness radio programs announcing available services, and educating on signs of high-risk pregnancies; advantages of medical support; family planning, etc.





HCDM is growing into a center of excellence for the people they serve, thanks to Pierre Antoine, our partner in Haiti, and Dr. Dasny Mackenson, HCDM Medical Director, who, with the administrative and technical staff, find solutions to the external environmental limitations (inconsistent fuel supply, unpredictable blood supply, road blockages, delayed receipt of supplies).

protocol and remained open to safely serve those in need in the areas of Delmas 60, Marlique, Croix-des-Bouquets, Lilavois







Our Haitian partner, Dr. Wilkens Gilbert, has devoted his career to improving medical care for those in need in his country. Through his devoted efforts, and with MATH, his family, and community support, Hôpital Bellevue-La-Montagne (HBLM) now provides general surgical services two days a week in the "Kathy Aries" operating rooms, greatly improving the health of patients, and emergency Cesarean Sections for maternal and infant survival and well-being.







CMCQ welcomed Dr. Daniel Jean as the new OB /GYN, and Josee Ladouceur CRNA and OR nurses from Bon Repos as part of the surgical team. In time, staff nurses, Hermeline Charles RN (HBLM) and Karina Desir RN (CMCQ Delmas 60) will complete OR training.

At HBLM, construction and equipping the hospital continues. The Labor & Delivery ward on Level 3 is almost complete, improvements to road and parking lot access are in progress, and dental and ophthalmology areas are set to open in 2021. Progress is limited only by available funding
