Dear Friends.

As I write this note, Haiti is in the throes of yet another crisis: gang violence. Our Haitian Medical Director, Dr. Wilkens Gilbert, along with his family



and staff, have been forced to sequester at Hôpital Bellevue-La-Montagne in the hills above Port-au-Prince. His home in Croix-des-Bouquet, which had been turned into a neighborhood clinic, closed as the civil unrest and violence escalated to the point that it was no longer safe to be open. A guard hired to protect the house was recently assaulted, the house ransacked and riddled with bullet holes, and both family dogs were killed. This assault was perpetrated by the same gang of criminals that kidnapped the group of 17 missionaries in October.

Remarkably, despite living amid the terror and violence that is gripping Haiti, MATH's in-country Port-au-Prince and Dame-Marie Projects continue to be operational and provide desperately needed medical care. I give thanks for the healthcare workers we support as they persevere in an environment, we can't even fathom.

On The Ground in Haiti Update

COVID-19: From 3 January 2020 to 2 November 2021, there have been 23,960 confirmed cases with 671 deaths reported to WHO. As of 29 October 2021, a total of 123,502 vaccine doses have been administered.(https://covid19.who.int/region/amro/country/ht)

Earthquake: Although the 7.2 magnitude earthquake on 14 Aug 2021 did little more than shake Port-au-Prince and points north, the south and its peninsula were affected with significant structural damage in the cities of Les Cayes and Jérémie and villages along the only road we take to Dame-Marie. Dame-Marie was spared significant damage and through the efforts of Pierre Antoine, Miss Beatrice Siméon, RN, and Association D'Entre Aide Des Dame-Mariens (AEADMA), HCDM mobilized a response team to provide medical and psycho-social care, medications, water, food, and personal hygiene items to stricken communities. In PaP, Dr. Wilkens and staff are providing follow-up care at HBLM to patients sent to trauma centers in Port-au-Prince.

Political Unrest: Gangs continue to pose significant threats to the already weak infrastructure. For now, MATH's focus is to provide resources to our Haitian colleagues living through this dire situation so they may continue providing medical and surgical care.

Partnership with Hôpital de la Communaute Dame-Marienne (HCDM)



Hospital Renovation

Major renovations were made to the hospital with USAID funds installation of doors and windows, masonry work, tiles, electrical upgrade, plumbing and painting.



The next phase is installation of an oxygen generator system that will replace H tanks currently used in the operating rooms, as well as becoming a source for other hospitals in the southwestern area of Haiti.

Maternal Health Care (MHC)

During the renovation, the Maternal Health Care Team of Drs. Adler Bonange and Jean Louis Judson (OB / GYN) spent 5 weeks in training for screening and management of precancerous lesions and cervical cancer. The training was a participatory internship with the gynecologists of the IHI (Innovation Health International) involving clinical screenings and thermocoagulation of precancerous lesions, and surgical interventions for cases of gynecological cancers.

Our mission teams have seen several cases over the years where intervention was too late. This training, along with the needed materials to conduct screenings and biopsies, will provide expanded gynecological services to benefit the women in Dame-Marie and surrounding areas.


